

Canonbah Bridge

Named after the old township of Canonbah, that bordered the McLaughlin's farm. In the early 1900's the township was deserted and to this day all that remains is the old Canonbah Bridge.

2006 Sauvignon Blanc

Vineyards:

Grown at high altitude in the central ranges of Orange, NSW. 1000 metres elevation.

Winemaking:

Fermented in stainless steel tanks to enhance the aromatics of the wine.

Technical Details:

Varietals - 100% Sauvignon Blanc

Bottling date: March 2007

pH: 3.45

Residual sugar: 1.9g/L

Alcohol: 13.5 % Vol

Tasting Note:

The Sauvignon Blanc is fermented in stainless steel tanks to retain vibrant passion-fruit and mineral characters. Delicate crisp, gooseberry and hints of asparagus linger on the palate. Well-balanced acidity.

Drink now with a cellar potential of up to 2 years.
